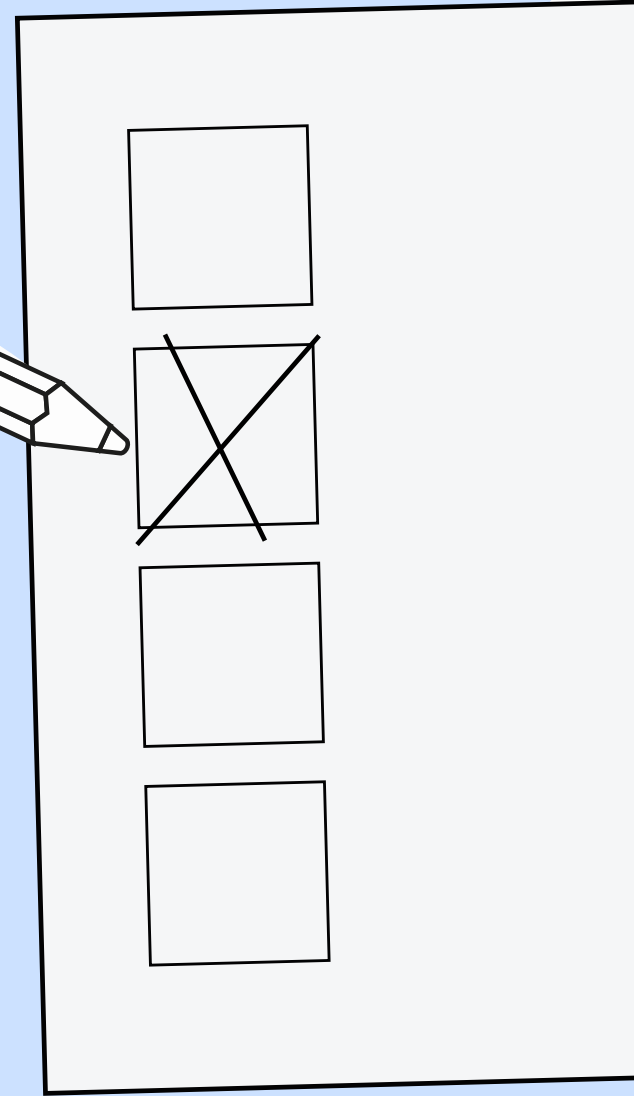
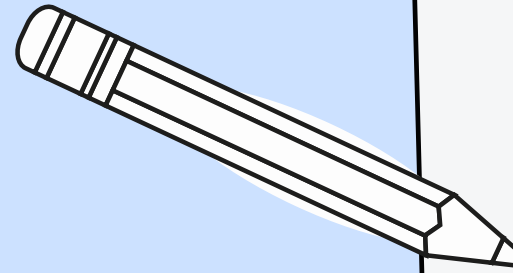

Between 2021 and 2026, UK universities will provide more than 11.6 million jobs, a 10% increase on the current level.

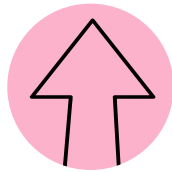

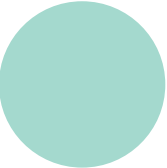
